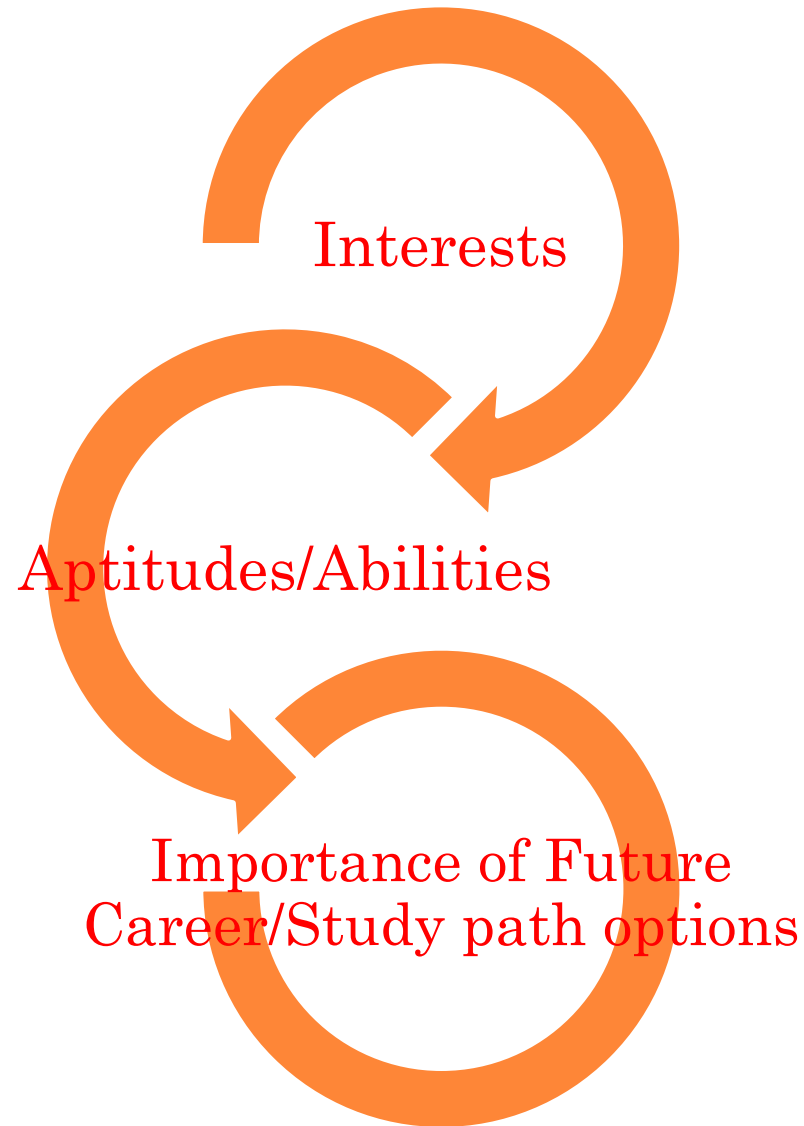

WHY SEVEN/EIGHT SUBJECTS?

- Leaving Cert points are calculated on the best **SIX** subjects
- The seventh or eighth subject can be a safety net



POINTS FOR HIGHER MATHS

- Provided you gain a Grade H6 or higher
- You gain 25 points + Grade points
- e.g.

H2 = 88 points (+25 points) = 113 points

REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIC COURSES

- NUI Colleges UCD (including NCAD), UCC, UCG and Maynooth)

Maths, Irish, English and a third language

(with the exception of Science, Engineering, Nursing, Social Science (UCD only) Business and Law (Maynooth NUI only) and Agricultural Science programmes)

- Trinity College, DCU, UL, TU Dublin, MTU (Munster Technological University) and IT's

Maths, Irish and English



- Primary Teaching
Irish H4

- Science subjects essential to study any of the following at university (preferably two in some cases):

Medicine, Architecture, Veterinary,
Science, Engineering, Radiography,
Physiotherapy, Agriculture

- Medicine, Veterinary, Pharmacy, Dentistry,
Dietetics

- Chemistry



- **Nursing** - A laboratory science subject, no third language required
- **Engineering**
 - NUI's, DCU, UL, TU Dublin and Trinity - Maths >H4
 - IT's - Maths O5 (with some exceptions)

If unsure of potential career path, it is advisable to choose subjects from different groups:

- Science
- Languages
- Business
- Arts/Humanities

LEAVING CERTIFICATE VOCATIONAL PROGRAMME

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LCVP

- Extra subject **not** an alternative Leaving Cert
- Can be counted as one of your **six** subjects for CAO points

Assessment:

- 60% for portfolio
 - CV, Career Investigation, Summary Report, Enterprise Action Plan, Work Experience, Recorded Interview.
- 40% for written exam (May)
 - Enterprise Education and World of Work

CAO POINTS

- **Distinction** **66 points** **(80% - 100%)**
- **Merit** **46 points** **(65% - 79%)**
- **Pass** **28 points** **(50% - 64%)**



RESEARCH, RESEARCH, RESEARCH...

- The number of courses which require specific subjects are quite limited, but these courses need to be researched.

REMEMBER!

- At Leaving Certificate, subjects are studied in greater **depth** so more **time** is needed for each subject.
- A significant amount of time should be given to each subject.
- Exercise caution if considering taking on a new subject for Leaving Certificate, consultation with subject teacher is required.



REMEMBER!

- Beware of bias or incorrect information
- The student should ask '*Is this right for me?*' They should **not be influenced negatively by others**
- It should be the student's personal decision

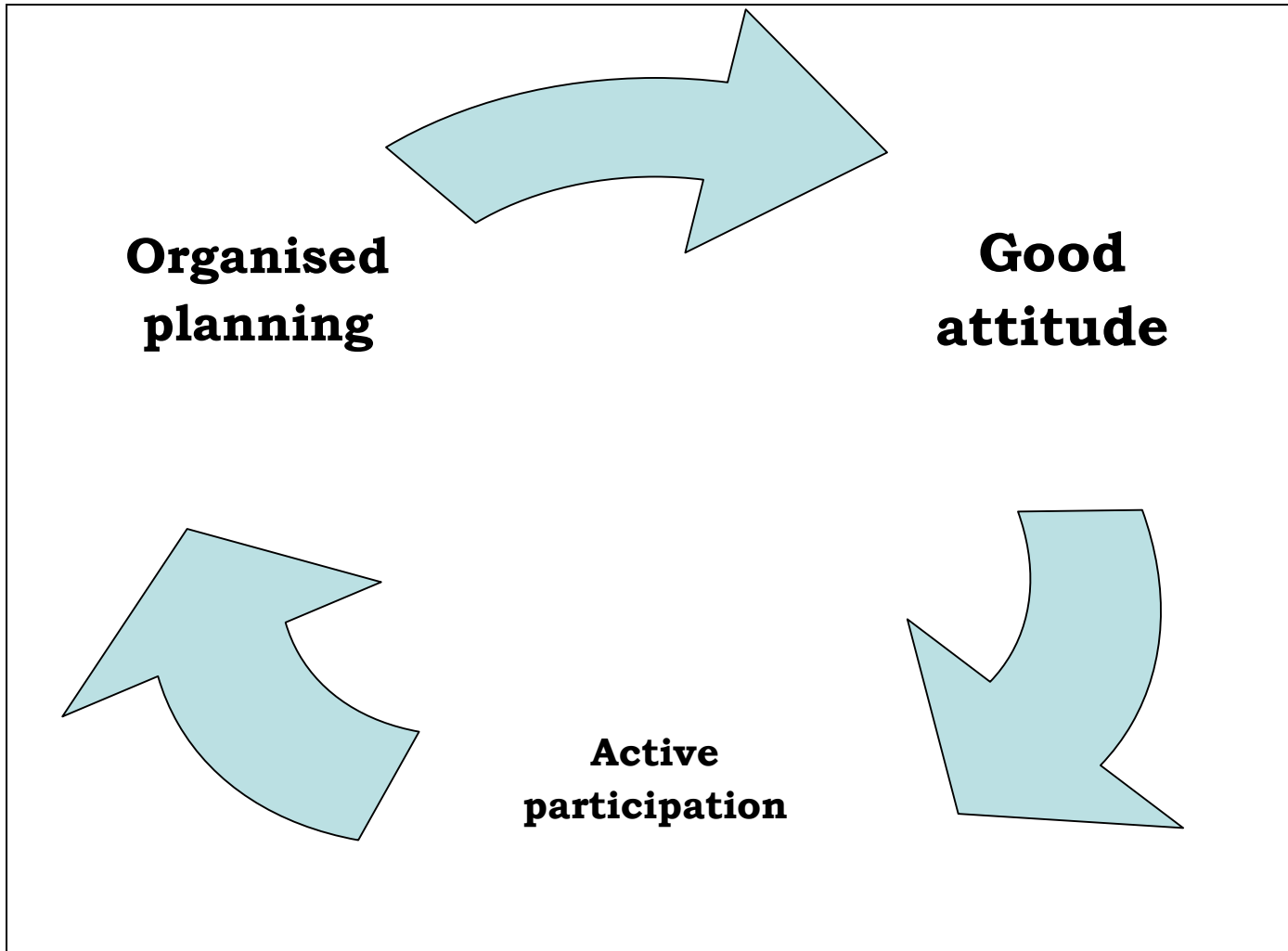
